# VIENNA

"Vienna is located 8 miles from Farmington, the Franklin County seat, and 25 miles from Augusta our state capital. It is the most northwesterly town in Kennebec County, and the smallest with a population of 527. Within Vienna's boundaries fall several small ponds: Egypt, Whittier, Black, Davis, Kidder, Boody and Kimball as well as the much larger Parker Pond and Flying Ponds. It is not any wonder why nearly half of the houses in Vienna are seasonal. Many of our famous Maine wild blueberries are picked on Davis and Vienna Mountains, spots from which pickers enjoy spectacular views of the Kennebec River Valley. The old Methodist church on Seavey Corner Road looks much the same today as when it was built nearly 200 years ago, complete with hanging oil chandeliers. The Vienna town house, located about 1/2 mile northwest of the village, is on the National Register of Historic Places. Vienna village is quaint and picturesque, her people warm and friendly with lots of community spirit!"
