The Maine Helpers Program[®]: Train-the-Trainer!

Become a Certified Helpers Trainer (CHT). A CHT can be any health professional with at least an Associates Degree who has been tobacco-free for at least one year. The certification period is three years.

CHTs are authorized to schedule and conduct their own Helpers Trainings. Helpers Trainings provide practical skills and information to both nonclinical professionals and to nonprofessional lay helpers who have a desire to assist Maine residents with quitting the use of tobacco.
